

- A member of a Germanic tribe who Jute invaded and settled in Britain in the 5th Century.
- Legendary King of England who fought the Anglo-Saxon invaders. 5 King Arthur Historians are not sure whether he existed or not.
- 6 King Athelstan King of England 925 - 939 AD.
- King of England, Denmark and **King Cnut** Norway 1016-1035AD.

KEY EVENTS

AD410 The Romans leave Britain.

Angles, Saxons and Jutes invade England **cAD450** and settle on the south and east coast.

The invaders claim England as their own cAD450-600 and divide the country into seven kingdoms.

King Ecgrith of Northumbria loses a battle to the Scottish Picts, ending Anglo-Saxon AD685 rule in England.

King Offa, the Anglo-Saxon king of Mercia, AD builds a wall to protect the border between his kingdom and the Welsh 785 kingdom of Powys.

Vikings attack the monastery of **AD793** Lindisfarne.

Vikings capture the city of York. **AD866**

Alfred of Wessex becomes king of the **AD871** Anglo-Saxons.

King Alfred agrees to share Britain with the **AD886** Vikings.

The Normans, under William, the Duke of 1066 Normandy invade from France and defeat the Anglo-Saxon King Harold
