English

We will be reading a stone age-based narrative and developing our existing story telling skills to write our own stone age story. We will then use our stone age knowledge to create a non-fiction information book to share as a class information book.

Maths

We will start with embedding our place value skills from Key Stage I developing these skills to ensure we can use them to help us secure our addition and subtraction skills. We will develop our problem-solving skills and use a range of math manipulatives to help our learning.

Science

We will be comparing and investigating the process of rock and mountain formations. We will use this to discover what happens to rocks during the weathering process and how this affects their uses. We will be discovering how fossils were made and investigating the different types of soils.

Humanities

We will be exploring how life in Britain changed from the Stone Age to the Iron Age? We will be learning how our life is different to the humans that lived during the Stone Age and how we know this. We will be exploring what was better and why during the Stone, Bronze and Iron Age.

PSHE

We will explore the individuality of each person within the class. It is used as an opportunity to get to know each other, realising what each person within the class has in common and what their differences are. Children will be encouraged to work together throughout the unit, developing their cooperation skills. Children will create their learning charter and agree on what rules and responsibilities we need to help us all get along.

Religious Education

We will be learning how festivals and worship show what matters to a Muslim. We will be thinking about how prayer is important to Muslims and make links between Muslim beliefs about God and a range of ways in which Muslims worship.

Music

We will be using a range of tunes percussion instruments to learn a range of tunes. We will learn how to listen to each other and to repeat and adapt a range of musical notes.

Art

We will be looking at the different techniques that were used in cave art and learning our colour wheel combinations and line drawing skills to enable us to create our own cave art.
