Spring Term 1



This half term, we are continuing to work on developing both our fiction and nonfiction writing by studying a range of high-quality encyclopaedia texts and writing a Ist person narrative to entertain our peers. We will focus on a range of literary and grammatical devices to draw in and hold our readers.

Maths

In Matha this half term, we are carrying on our work with Mixed Numbers before moving on to multiplying and dividing fractions. Following this, we use BODMAS to approach problems including multiple operations. Following our Mock SATs, we will then review topics that were not secure.

Science

In science this term, our topic is 'Electricity'. Throughout this unit, we will find out how to identify components and create electrical circuits. From here, we plan to use that knowledge and build a set of traffic lights.

Religious Education

In this unit of RE, we will be looking Christianity and at the questions 'What kind of king was Jesus?". We will be talking about what a better world would be like. Gather ideas about some of the problems in the world (e.g. hunger, poverty, violence, lack of healthcare, etc.) and find out about some people who have made a difference to the world.

Humanities

This term in Year 6 we will be studying another geography unit which looks at widening our understanding of what migration is and how and why people migrate from place to place.

Music

This half term we are aiming for the children to be able to sing musically for purpose. We will be looking at the structure of chorale music, identifying between monophonic, homophonic and polyphonic. Ultimately, we will be able to perform a choral song with harmony.

PSHF

Our PSHE lessons this term will help us to embed the values of Orchard Academy and help us to become better learners, as we demonstrate that we are always Ready, Respectful and Safe.

We are switching back over to an art unit this first half of Spring and we are going to be learning about African mask art. We will be studying the various styles of masks worn by a few African countries and acknowledging the meaning before constructing an abstract form of our own.

Spanish

Homework

How you can help at home
