Dear parents, Carers of children on Year 5,

Welcome back to the new academic year. I hope you managed to enjoy the summer holidays, despite the variable British summer weather! Hopefully children are feeling refreshed and ready to begin the next stage of their learning journey at Orchard Academy. Outlined in this letter is some important and useful information about the year ahead.

The Year 5 Team

We have three classes in Year 5; Sycamore (taught by Mrs Greene), Rowan (taught by Mrs Brown) and Willow (taught by Mr Allwood). We are supported by the following Teaching Assistants; Mrs Taylor, Mrs Kohutova, Miss Ephgrave and Miss Cahill who will be working across all three classes throughout the week.

PE Lessons

PE will take place on the following days for each class:

- Sycamore will have PE on Wednesday and Thursday
- Rowan will have PE on Wednesday and Friday
- Willow will have PE on Tuesday and Wednesday

Children should be appropriately dressed in their PE kit on these days. A reminder that all items of jewellery must be removed for PE lessons, including studded earrings and watches. PE lessons often taken place outdoors throughout the year and so children should be dressed appropriately for the weather. The approved PE Kit is as follows:

- Orchard Red PE T-shirt
- Navy shorts
- Navy jumper / Tracksuit bottoms for colder weather
- Trainers (not plimsols)
- Football boots
- Waterproof jacket (weather dependent)

This term, children will be learning how and why we warm up in different ways for different events. Developing specific area of fitness. In Tag Rugby, we will be building on the skills taught in Year 4 to play advantage and restart after infringements. All lessons will delivered by Miss Shaw or our Sports Coaches from Premier Sports.

Homework

Year 5 Homework will be sent home on a Friday and should be returned by the following Wednesday. It will consist of a Maths Key Skills sheet, which is designed to help build fluency

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with core maths skills. We will send home some spelling and grammar tasks to complete and encourage children to spend time everyday reading. If children need help with their homework, then we offer support on a Tuesday lunchtime which is open to anyone who wants to attend. It is the expectation that all children will complete the homework tasks each week.

Reading

In Year 5 we have a big focus on reading. All children will be issued with a school reading book which teachers will have matched to their reading ability. They will need this in school every day and it can be taken home to read too.

We will have a 'Reading for Pleasure' session every day. During this time, staff will hear children read and talk to them about the book. Children should be reading at home every day too either on their own or with an adult. As children become more fluent readers, they might choose to spend more time reading independently, but we encourage them still read with an adult some of the time too. All children should also have a school library book too. They will visit the library at least once a week.

General Housekeeping

In order to maximise space in cloakrooms, please consider the items that really need to come into school. Children do not need large heavy bags. They should have an Orchard Book Bag, or a small backpack to carry their reading book and homework book, which should be in school every day. They will also need a named water bottle which should only have water in for drinking in lessons. There is no communal water fountain in the Year 5/6 building so water bottles are essential.

In Year 5, children do not need to bring in pencil cases as all of the stationary that they need in lessons will be provided. Teachers will not be allowing pencil cases out in the classroom, so please do not send them into school.

All whole school communications will be sent to your Arbor account, so please check this regularly. There may be some individualised notes or messages sent to your child, so please check bags/book bags each day for messages that might have been sent home also.

If you have any questions, please talk to either your child's class teacher, the school office or myself who will be happy to assist.
